

**Launch of the National Action Plan Academy
December 3-5, 2014 Washington, DC**

Country Commitments

AFGHANISTAN

Commitment to build upon existing successes:

1. We the technical working group, commit to share the Afghan NAP and implementation and M&E plan with senior leadership of relevant government ministries by March 2015.
2. We, government and civil society, commit to support the development of ministries operational plans by the technical support of the Institute for Inclusive Security by September 2015.
3. We, steering committee member, commit to organize quarterly monitoring visits to relevant ministries and get reports in June, September, and December.

Commitments to address gaps:

1. We, government and civil society, commit to lobbying international community for allocation of specific NAP budget for Afghanistan by December 2015.
2. We, steering committee and technical committee, commit to improving coordination, expand information sharing with communities as well as among ourselves through media.

BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

Commitment to build upon existing successes:

1. **To promote NAP academy until March of 2015:** NGOs (had insisted for many years on promoting 1325, and now I have a promise of support from my government, so I will put it on my website which is established and you can see it from all parts of the world. Also, we will finish preparing materials/record them there until March 2015. Also, promote it through all local TV stations (with which I have connections/agreements that they are taking all my vid shoots and TV shows. We will finish my film and put it on my website. We will spread the word, connecting and recording on my network of Bonaventura.
2. To promote 1325 and all activities related to that, **both in our country and in this network** (that we've made at Inclusive Security), in what we created in a NAP academy.
3. We commit to create/establish/develop **two local action plans** for implementation of 1325 until 2016.

Commitments to address gaps:

1. We commit to **fundraising money for regional corporations** (to undertake activities on regional level) for the network of the Balkan region during 2015.
2. We are committed to **finish our M & E plan with Inclusive Security** until March 2015.
3. Develop/**finish our operationalization plans of Coordination Board** for 1325 action plan through March 2015.
4. We are committed to organizing **training for gender focal points within the security and defense sector** in Bosnia Herzegovina until June 2015.

GHANA

Commitment to build upon existing successes:

1. Provide resources to all NAP activities throughout.
2. Establish coordinating mechanism by March 2015.
3. Review the current NAP and establish long-term and mid-term reviews by July 2015.

Commitments to address gaps:

1. Continue monitoring and evaluation, data gathering, and analysis.
2. Continue sensitization and public education.
3. Popularize Do's and Don'ts of NAPs.

INDONESIA

Commitment to build upon existing successes:

1. We Indonesian delegation of National Action Plan Academy, government officials and CSO representatives, commit to publishing detailed indicators of Indonesian NAP and make it as realistic as possible by the end of 2015.
2. We, government officials and civil society representatives of Indonesia NAP, commit to advocating the operationalization of NAP among ministries regarding program and budget but the end of 2015.
3. We, government officials and civil society representatives of Indonesia NAP, commit to developing MoU to make sure civil society organizations have access to funds for their activities with regard to implementation of NAP by June 2015.
4. We, government officials and civil society representatives of Indonesia NAP, commit to developing monitoring tools and reporting guidance of local action plan development by end of 2015.
5. We, government officials and civil society representatives of Indonesia NAP, commit to strengthen movement building among women's rights and civil society and other movements to support NAP implementation by end of 2015.
 - Under alliances and ownership

JAPAN

Commitment to build upon existing successes:

1. We, government officials and civil society, commit to finalize our NAP by March 2015.
2. We, government officials and civil society, commit to disseminating the NAP through mass media, members of Parliament, NGOs, and the international community.

Commitments to address gaps:

1. We, government officials and civil society representatives of Japan, commit to reviewing and improving NAP including indicators and reporting and finally finalize our NAP by March 2015.

THE NETHERLANDS

Commitment to build upon existing successes:

1. We the coordinators of the Dutch NAP, commit to:
 - Continued *equal* collaboration and coordination between government and civil society in the development, implementation and review of our own NAP
 - Aim to maintain funding for the NAP
 - An *inclusive* review of NAP 2 and development of NAP 3

Commitments to address gaps:

1. We the coordinators of the Dutch NAP, commit to:
 - Create wider alliances and ownership around the objectives of the National Action Plan within our own organizations by the launch of our new third NAP (end of 2015)
 - To further define the roles and responsibilities of the NAP coordinators by the end of 2014
 - To facilitate a session where all NAP signatories can further define their *own* roles and contributions to the NAP before the launch of our new third NAP (as part of the development of NAP 3)
 - To organize a Theory of Change session (including looking back at the lessons learned) with the NAP signatories by mid-2015 as a basis for our NAP 3.”

NORWAY

Commitment to build upon existing successes:

1. We, representatives of government and civil society in Norway, commit to further developing the cooperation between the government and civil society by 2016.
2. We commit to improving and simplifying the monitoring system by 2016.
3. We commit to strengthening both political and public support for the WPS agenda by 2015.

Commitments to address gaps:

1. We commit to bridging gaps between our NAP and overall political strategies by 2017.
2. We commit to training and nominating women for international leadership positions related to peace and security by 2017.
3. We commit to creating a more transparent system of financing WPS projects by 2018.

UNITED STATES

Commitment to build upon existing successes:

1. We, the US and Civil Society Working Group, commit to: we will work towards establishing a more formal working relationship with the Civil Society Working Group.
2. We will work towards having more concrete analysis in our reporting and we will work with Civil Society on recommendations and best practices to conduct this analysis.
